

Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI-2)

The AAPI-2 has proven invaluable in assessing parenting attitudes and child-rearing beliefs of parents and adolescents. Founded on five parenting constructs known to lead to abusive parenting, the AAPI-2 provides scores that profile parents at risk for abusing and neglecting children.

Nurturing Skills Competency Scale (NSCS)

The NSCS is an inventory designed to gather information, both past and current, about individuals and their families in order to alert family members as well as professionals about on-going conditions that could lead to the initial occurrence of child maltreatment or the recurrence of child maltreatment.

Nurturing Parenting Programs meet and exceed the 6 Protective Factors identified by the U.S. Government for the prevention and treatment of Child Abuse and Neglect.
