The AAPI-2 has proven invaluable in assessing the parenting attitudes and child-rearing beliefs of parents and adolescents. Founded on five parenting constructs known to lead to abusive parenting, the AAPI provides scores that profile parents at risk for abusing and neglecting children. - A **minimum** of 3 years' experience as a trainer as well as experience facilitating at least two Nurturing Parenting Programs as written for the complete number of sessions (Full fidelity)
- Expertise in the philosophy and goals of Nurturing Parenting as demonstrated by successful group or home-based implementation of the programs;
- Expertise in the Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI-2) and other assessments and inventories of the Nurturing Programs;
- A letter from your supervisor attesting to your success as a trainer within your designated agency.

Training of Trainers Workshop

This is a workshop for experienced facilitators of the Nurturing Parenting Programs who would like to train facilitators. The agenda includes...

- The Nurturing Parenting Program philosophy, values, structure, and validation.
- Review of current programs and materials and how to effectively utilize them to fit agency needs and client populations including practical applications of group processes and dynamics; training styles, activities, use of A/V materials; and assessment and program evaluation strategies (including the Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI-2).
- Current information on research and findings in the fields of parent education, child abuse and neglect, and cultural parenting issues and how to successfully incorporate the Programs into grant and funding opportunities.
- Review of current Best Practices
- How to conduct Facilitator Trainings.
- How to monitor the fidelity of Nurturing Parenting Programs

Criteria for National TOT Requirements:

- Successful completion of a 3 day Nurturing Program Facilitator Training conducted by a *Recognized Trainer/Consultant* (bring to the training to give to the trainer) followed by:
- A **minimum** of 5 years experience implementing two or more of the Nurturing Parenting Programs as written for the complete number of sessions (**proof of this is on your facilitator certificate**).
- Expertise in the philosophy and goals of Nurturing Parenting as demonstrated by successful group or home-based implementation of the programs (will be observed in the training);
- Expertise in the Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI-2) and other assessments (NSCS and PARTI) and inventories of the Nurturing Programs (will be observed in the training);
- **Two letters** of recommendation attesting to your success facilitating the program and your abilities as a trainer. (**bring to the training to give to trainer**)

Recognition of National and Organization TOT is granted upon 1) successful completion of the training based on the recommendations of the trainer; 2) submittal of a Trainer/Consultant application with subsequent approved by Family Development Resources, Inc. and 3) other criteria as outlined in the application.
