The philosophy of Nurturing Parenting is founded on seven principles: Feelings of Attachment, Empathy, Nurturing Oneself, Gentle Touch, Discipline, Expressing Feelings and Expectations and Self Worth.

The Nurturing Parenting Programs are recognized by the National Registry of Effective Programs and Practices (NREPP), the Substance Abuse-Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP.) The training will focus on incorporating the philosophy, skills, and strategies of nurturing parenting. Participants will learn how to design home-based and group-based parenting programs utilizing the proven lessons of the Nurturing Parenting Programs. This is a hands-on approach to conducting home and group based Nurturing Programs that includes facilitating weekly sessions, how to use program materials, videos and assessment tools, children's and parents' program activities, family home lessons, activities for personal power, alternatives to corporal punishment, building self-esteem, self-concept and empathy in parents and children. Participants will learn how to use the online version of the Adult-Adolescent Inventory and Nurturing Skills Competency Scale to gather pre and post outcome data. **Class size is limited to 12 individuals.**
